

Transportation



- All Students requiring transportation (city/county) need to register on the school website.
 The online registration link for the 2025-2026 school year opens on April 15, 2025. The
 deadline for registration is June 13, 2025.
- County Transit
 - County students ride a YELLOW charter bus. Your driver will call you before the school year starts notifying you of location and times.
- City Transit
 - City students will ride City of Red Deer Transit on school days. If you live greater than 2 kms from SJHS your city bus pass will be free. If you live closer than 2 kms there is a fee for the city bus pass. All bus passes are Unrestricted (any bus/any time)
 - Please see the City of Red Deer Website for city transit bus routes and times
 - City Transit passes are available at the office in September

Credit Information



- For a high school diploma in Alberta: 100 credits required
 (English 30, Social 30, Math 20, Science 20, PE 10, CALM, 10 CTS Credits, 10 30 Level Credits)
- To participate in St. Joseph's graduation ceremony, students need to complete 100 credits (RS courses required per year in high school)
 - High school runs on a two semester system
 - There are 4 blocks of classes in a day and we run on a 2 day schedule.
 - 5 credit courses students take every day
 - 3 credit courses student take every day
 - CTS classes are offered in modules that are 1 credit each
